Opening with a musical interlude as played on the new Hammond Novochoord by our Ed Borgens, and finishing with a most excellent talk on the early history of our constitutional government under the first president, George Washington, the program was a very well balanced one and was much enjoyed.

The instrument played by Ed is a new one in the line of musical instruments and is a marvel in its adaptabilities to the various tonal ranges and qualities.

Without strings, yet it reproduces piano and organ tunes as well as violin, cello, cornet, trombone and in fact any kind of reed or wind instrument, simply by a turn of a dial in the "dash board."

Electrical power and sound tubes are used in this instrument and the only thing that was lacking, was a complete hour of this fine music produced through the deft and trained fingers of Ed Borgens.

For the information of members who would like to hear more of this musical wonder, this club will meet at an interclub meeting with the Ocean Beach Club and the entire program will be devoted to music from this Novochoord at the hands of
