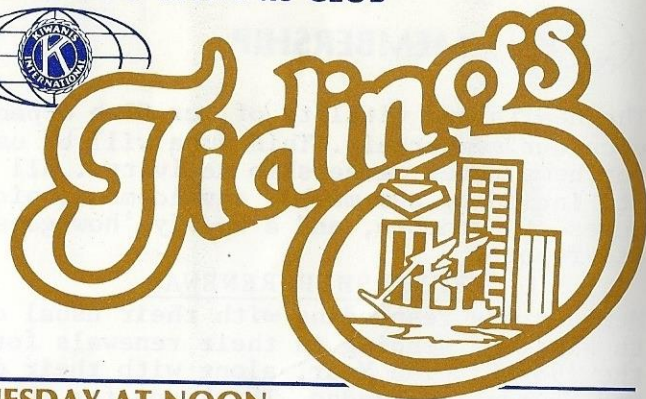

THE PROGRAM

DENNIS CONNER, winner of the "AMERICA'S CUP" started competitive sailing in San Diego as a teenager, sailing as the last band on boats owned by such well-known talents as Ash Bown, Malin Burnham, Bill Fox, etc..

In 1971, with Jim Reynolds as crew, Dennis won his first major title -- the Star Worlds. In '72, Conner subsequently won the first of two consecutive Congressional Cup match racing series in Long Beach -- the sport's most important annual match racing event.

Three times, he captured the SORC's, the World Series of offshore sailboat racing -- overall title, beating out 90 of the world's best skippers. Twice he sailed in England's famed Admiral's Cub.

In 1977 he became the first skipper in the history of the Star Worlds to win the title with six straight wins.

In 1978, Conner accepted the helm of the Freedom-Enterprise campaign.

MALIN BURNHAM, President, John Burnham & Co.. In his sailing activity, Malin won 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th & two 7ths in World Championships; two 2nds in U.S. Olympic Trials in the Star Class. In Challenge Racing; winning skipper four times in the San Diego Lipton Cup, and winning skipper three times in the San Francisco Perpetual Challenge Cup. In Ocean Racing; 1st, 2nd and 3rd skippering Invader/Ericson-46 in the San Diego Fleet Championships. In 1976 Miami, won the Nassau race as the guest skipper on the Bumblebee III.

Malin is Executive Vice-President, International Star Class, Yacht Racing Association and Past Commodore, San Diego Yacht Club.
