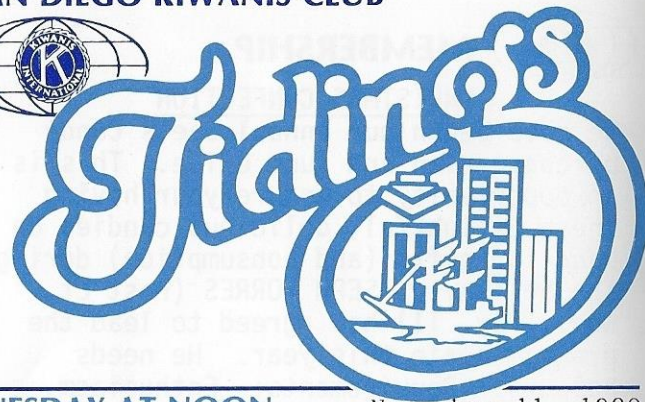

THE PROGRAM

HERB KLEIN has enjoyed a unique career as a newspaperman, broadcast official, senior leader in the White House and participated in five presidential campaigns. He had his own media consultancy business.

His career as a "newspaperman's newsman" spans broadcast and public service which earned him honor and distinction. Herb is nationally known as a newspaper editor and for his role as the senior spokesman for the Executive Branch of the U. S. Government. For almost five years he served in the White House as the nation's first Director of Communications. (He still continues as an unpaid consultant to the White House and the Executive Branch of Government.) In 1973 he became Vice President for Corporate Relations for Metro-media, Inc., a national communication corporation which is the nation's leading non-network broadcasting group.

As a media consultant, Mr. Klein worked with several multi-billion dollar corporations in the fields of international press and public relations. One of the corporations was the Minneapolis Star-Tribune Co. and its newspaper, television and magazine affiliates, including Harper's Magazine.

Herb is a member of the University of Southern Cal's Board of Trustees and is a Past President of the General Alumni.

Mr. Klein's book, "MAKING IT PERFECTLY CLEAR", was published Sept. 12, 1980. He recounts his experiences in the world of government and the press with a personal style and insight which Doubleday, his publisher, feels is a remarkably balanced and analytical manuscript.

...CONNIE KARABERIS is successfully recovering from surgery and should be home by the time you read this.

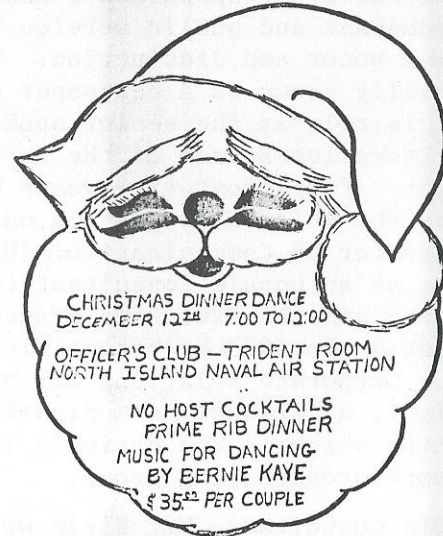
...OZ THORESON is home recovering from very successful eye surgery. Claims the new surgery technique is a miracle!
