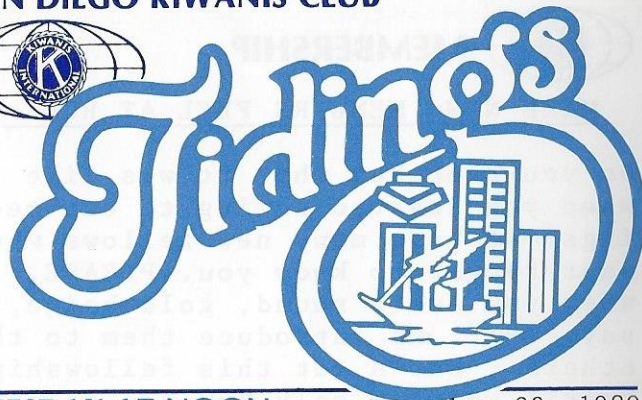

THE PROGRAM

Dr. Shinichi Suzuki, a Japanese violin teacher, was trained in Germany and for the last 46 years has been involved in the development of a highly effective method of teaching instrumental music to young children. The method is based on what is called the mother language method where the child first learns to play the instrument, then later is taught to read music. A high degree of parental participation is essential for success with the method. Children have begun training at the age of two. Work is now being done in the areas of violin, cello, piano and flute.

DR. T. R. "TED" BRUNSON is the Director of the Suzuki Strings at San Diego State University. Members of this group each have a weekly private lesson and additionally meet together once a week for an ensemble session. Dr. Brunson is trying to expand in the cello area. Since the students have to furnish their own instruments, the cost of the cello is prohibitive to most of them.

This class has served as a pilot program for the county and children are being taught in other colleges by teachers trained at San Diego State University.

20 talented youngsters will be with us Tuesday. Two of the youngsters (now in college) are part of the original group that played for us in March, 1974.

What a delightful part of our Holiday Season the "Suzuki Strings" will be! Don't miss it...!! Be sure to bring your wife and friends...!



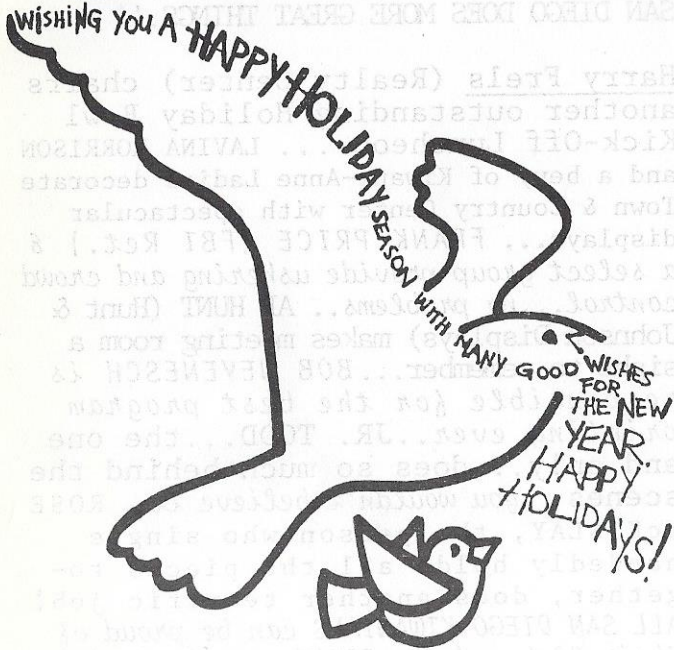

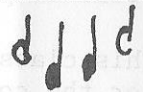
