FRED WHITACRE, President & General Manager, San Diego Sockers came to San Diego after two successful seasons with Vancouver Whitecaps as Vice President. He won two straight divisional titles in the Soccer Bowl.

He has had two sports careers - one in baseball where he served as General Manager of various clubs, and then to Soccer. For three consecutive seasons ('73-'75) he was chosen as Florida's State League Executive of the Year.

RON NEWMAN is a fixture in the North American Soccer League. A member of the league - as both a player and coach since its inception. 13 years ago, this NASL veteran's accomplishments are paralleled by few. His personality and winning spirit matched by none.

Newman is the man that Bob Bell hired late last season to "turn things around" for the Socks. He wanted a man who could relate to players and fans alike, and give San Diego an exciting high-scoring winning team. In the short stint that Ron led the club last season, nobody could have asked for more. Taking over a sub .500 team he directed it to a 6-5 record, a playoff berth and ultimately the American Conference Championship series.

Ron is the only man to win championships in both the North American Soccer League and the American Soccer League. He is also the only man to be named Coach of the Year in both the NASL and American Soccer League.
