Beginning his career as a US postal clerk and a member of the American Postal Workers Union in Phoenix, Jerry embarked upon his path to leadership in 1975, when he was elected vice-president and later president of the local in 1978. Answering a calling to great weather and beautiful scenery, Jerry and his family headed west to California in 1980. He was elected president of the local APWU in Oceanside, soon after beginning work at the post office. Jerry continued to represent working families when, in 1981, the Central Labor Council of San Diego and Imperial Counties selected him as their community services liaison between organized labor and the United Way. After a fifteen year tenure of providing aid to working families with the United Way, Jerry embraced the challenge of revitalizing Labor's role in the community. He ran for the office of Secretary-Treasurer of the Labor Council, and was elected in 1996, winning reelection in 2000.

Today, Jerry continues to serve as the executive officer of the Labor Council, striving to provide all Californians with a fair wage, affordable health care and a safe working environment.
