THE PROGRAM

GENERAL LEMUEL C. SHEPHERD, JR., USMC, ret., was born in Virginia and graduated from the Virginia Military Institute.

Serving in the Marine Corp during World War I, he is an acknowledged hero of the Battle of Belleau Wood, where he was gravely wounded. Later he served in Haite and China.

During World War II he commanded a Brigade and subsequently the Sixth Marine Division in the landing at Okinawa.

General Shepherd commanded all Marines in the Pacific at the beginning of the Korean War and became the 20th Commandant of the Marine Corp in which position he served from 1952 until his retirement in 1955.

General and Mrs. Shepherd reside in La Jolla.
