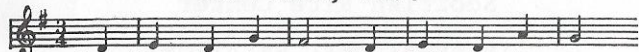

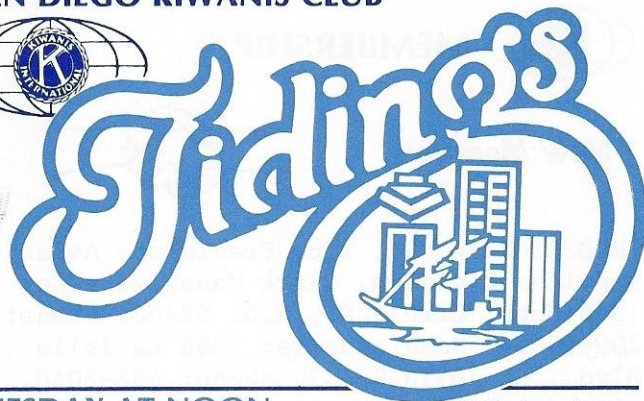

THE PROGRAM

MAJOR DAVID RILEY was born in New York City, is the third generation Army Officer of his family, and has lived in Hell's Kitchen, New York, Bronx, Pittsburgh, Pa. & Schenectady, N.Y.

Major earned his BA and MA in Social Science from CSUSD and is now working on Doctorate material in Guidance Counseling

Major Riley is an Ordained Minister and because of his unique position is called upon to occupy the pulpit of many denominations as a guest preacher.

Following his appointments as second in command in Arizona, Northern California and Southern California, he served as Public Relations Secretary for the Western States. He held a unique position in Tucson, Arizona, as City Coordinator of all Salvation Army work, including Corps (2), Family Services, Transient Lodge, Pre-Release Halfway House, and Director of the Men's Social Service Center simultaneously; the only such command in the USA.

As Territorial Director of all Men's Social Service Programs, he is responsible for the Program of Rehabilitation as well as the Work Therapy Salvage Program. This self-support service operates in 26 Centers of Operation, serving over 2,000 men and women in residence. In addition there are 1,800 employees, 240 Thrift Stores, and a fleet of 530 vehicles.

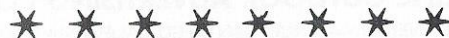
