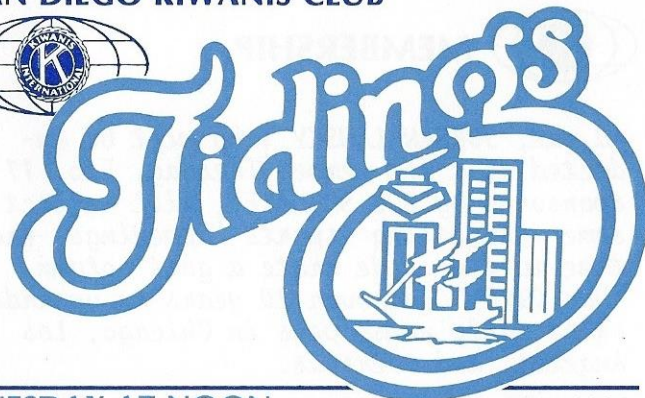

THE PROGRAM

FRANK HOWARD was named manager of the San Diego Padres October 1980. He had been a coach with the Milwaukee Brewers the last four seasons after managing the Brewers' Spokane farm club in 1976.

Mr. Howard joined the Dodgers in 1960 after a sensational minor league season in 1959 at Victoria of the Texas League and Spokane of the Pacific Coast League. He hit 23-homers and drove 77-runs for the 1960 Dodgers and was honored as National League rookie of the year.

In 1962 with the Dodgers, Howard batted .296 with 31-homers and 119-RBI. He was traded to Washington after the 1964 season and twice led the American League in home runs, belting 44-homers in both 1968 and 1970. Actually his career high in home runs was 1969 when he hit 48. His 126-RBI and 132 walks led the American League in 1970.

Howard holds the major league record for most home runs in one week (10), most home runs in five consecutive games (8) and most homers in six consecutive games (10). He played in one world series (1963) with the Dodgers and four All-Star games (1968-71) for the American while a member of the Senators. He concluded his major league career with Detroit in 1973.

Frank attended Ohio State University where he became an All-Big-10 selection and team captain in basketball as well as starring in baseball.

MEMBERSHIP

Ad man, JORDAN LANSKY (who will be inducted as a new member Tuesday, Feb. 17 - sponsored by BOB SHUMAKE), will reflect some interesting 'sports happenings' from time to time. Last December the American Tunaboat Association honored the winner of the Lon Brito Award for achievement in the reduction of porpoise mortality for the years 1977 through 1979. Captain Manuel Jorge received the "Golden Porpoise" award.

Captain Jorge joined nine other top skippers in the U.S. Tuna Fleet. During this three year period, these 10 skippers pursued over 1.2 million porpoises associated with tuna in the Eastern Pacific. The number of porpoises encircled in the tuna nets after such pursuit was estimated by government observers to be about 754,000. According to government records the total mortality resulting during this three year period was 536 animals - an astounding feat. Such mortality represented about 100th of one percent of the porpoise encircled by these top 10 skippers. The Captains were responsible for the observers over this three year period, even paying their wages.

AUGIE FELANDO is very proud of this report and our Environment & Conservation Committee plan on honoring the ten skippers at a regular Tuesday meeting in the near future.
