THE FELLOWSHIP LUNCHEON WAS HOSTED BY OUR KIWANIS CLUB WITH PRESIDENT MARK MC DONALD CHAIRING THE MEETING. THE ENTERTAINMENT WAS OUTSTANDING WITH LIVELY SPIRITED MUSIC BY THE

YOUNG BURN SURVIVORS LEARN TO SEE BEYOND THE SCARS



KIWANIS CLUB OF SAN DIEGO SPONSORS LOCAL WEEKEND BURN CAMP

THIRTY SEVERELY BURN-INJURED CHILDREN FROM SAN DIEGO AND ORANGE COUNTIES WILL GATHER MARCH 3 - 5, AT CAMP MARSTON NEAR JULIAN TO ENJOY OUTDOOR ACTIVITIES AND PARTICIPATE IN PROGRAMS DESIGNED TO MEET THEIR SPECIAL NEEDS.

"THESE CHILDREN ARE BURN SURVIVORS WHO SHARE A COMMON BOND-- THEY'VE ENDURED THE PAIN OF RECOVERY FROM A BURN INJURY," SAID LESIA STOCKALL, DIRECTOR OF SUPPORT SERVICES AT THE BURN INSTITUTE.

ACCORDING TO STOCKALL, WHEN CHILDREN ARE BURN-INJURED, THEY TEND TO ISOLATE THEMSELVES FROM THEIR PEERS, FEARING REJECTION. CAMP AFFORDS YOUNG BURN SURVIVORS THE OPPORTUNITY TO MAKE LIFE-LONG FRIENDS AND TO SHARE STORIES AND EXPERIENCES WITH EACH OTHER.

THE CAMP PROGRAM FOR BURN-INJURED CHILDREN, ESTABLISHED IN 1987, IS ONE OF THE BURN INSTITUTE'S MOST SUCCESSFUL ACTIVITIES. THIS YEAR'S WINTER CAMP HAS BEEN FUNDED BY THE KIWANIS CLUB OF SAN DIEGO.

CHILDREN ARE SELECTED FOR CAMP BY MEMBERS OF THE LOCAL MEDICAL COMMUNITY. THE CAMPERS ARE ACCOMPANIED BY INSTITUTE STAFF, FIRE-FIGHTERS AND ADULT BURN SURVIVORS WHO VOLUNTEER THEIR TIME AS COUNSELORS.

THE BURN INSTITUTE IS A LOCAL NONPROFIT HEALTH AGENCY DEDICATED TO REDUCING THE NUMBER OF BURN INJURIES AND DEATHS IN SAN DIEGO AND IMPERIAL COUNTIES THROUGH BURN PREVENTION EDUCATION. THE FUNDING OF BURN CARE RESEARCH AND TREATMENT AND BURN SURVIVOR SUPPORT SERVICES.
