## OCEAN BEACH

Highlights of his 25 months war service in the Southwest Pacific were told the Ocean Beach Kiwanians at their meeting of Tuesday evening by Capt. O. W. Todd of the U. S. Marine Corps. He told of his experiences while serving as a morale and recreations officer and was introduced by Myron Insko, program chairman for the evening.

The speaker particularly emphasized the kind and generous treatment given by New Zealanders to the 8,000 Americans who were ill there at one time with malaria, contracted on nearby islands. "We Americans owe those people a debt we can never fully repay," he said.

Answering the criticism that the Marines may come back changed and possibly brutalized by their war experiences in the Pacific theatre, Capt. Todd said there is no foundation for such criticism, that when these boys come back "we'll find them the best citizens this world has ever seen."

At the business session, Treasurer Henry Holman was presented by President Jerry Sullivan with a pin signifying five years of perfect attendance at the meetings, and J. R. Lownes and F. F. Swan each with a one-year pin, signifying one year of perfect attendance.

Visitors Tuesday included Bob Fuller of the La Mesa Club, Dick Barbour of the San Diego Club; Al Keogh, theatre owner, a guest of Don Thomson; Lieut. James Williams, a guest of Don Cochrane; and Wm. Getz, a guest of James Roberts.
