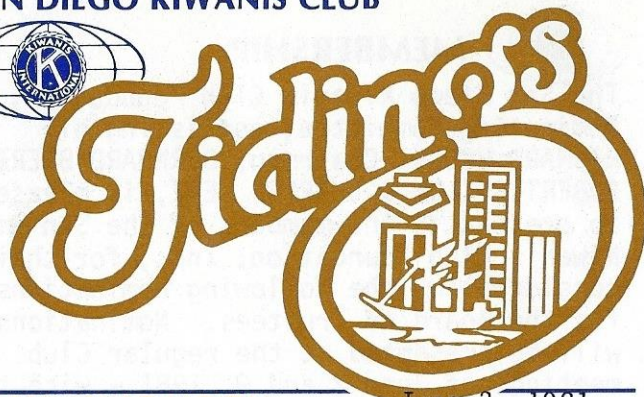

THE PROGRAM

DR. STUART MERRIAM, PhD, Director of the Highland Christian Mission of Papua, New Guinea, established this Mission in 1964. It has grown from a small outpost to a Mission that houses and educates over 500 students and serves a community of several thousand. Dr. Merriam was a pastor of the sister church of Norman Vincent Peale's main church before going to New Guinea.

He will bring three of his students, each from a different tribe, dressed in native costume, with him. They will have a large display of items depicting the life style of the tribes and the students will be explaining and showing us many of their customs.

Papua New Guinea, with its more than 2½ million people - speaking over 700 languages and dialects, is a spectacularly beautiful land of soaring mountains, wide open valleys, fast moving rivers and giant rain forests. Before World War II, much of the island was unknown and remained in a Stone Age culture. Less than forty years ago, no white man had ever visited the Yagusa Valley wherein lies the Highland Christian Mission. Stone axes and sharpened bamboo knives were used in place of steel. Tree bark served for blankets. The wheel was unknown!

Dr. Merriam is a fascinating and exciting speaker - fast becoming the top speaker of the year.

This promises to be one of the top programs of the year.

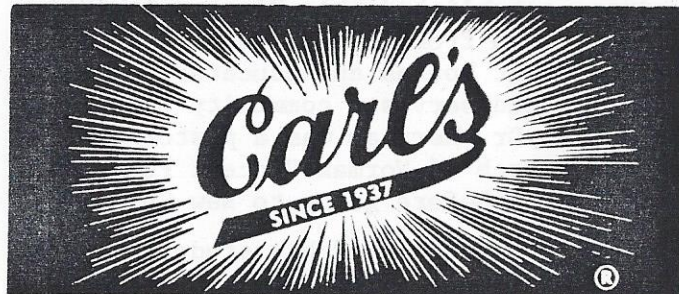
