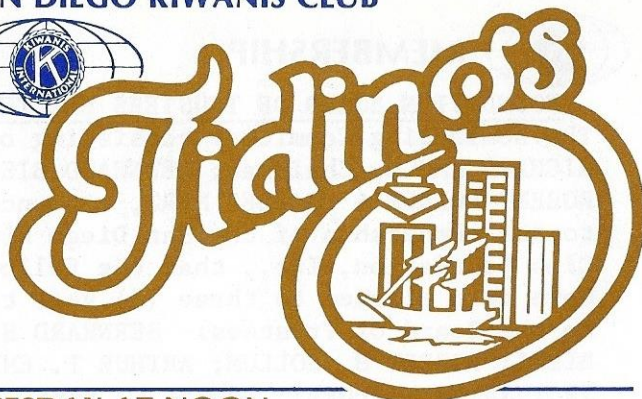

## THE PROGRAM

CLYDE LEECH, former newspaper reporter for the Herald Express and Los Angeles Examiner, came to San Diego to retire. He found he needed some activity to keep him busy and Chief of Police, Bill Kollerder, persuaded him to take over the "Adam 65" program.

"Adam 65" is a community funded program of crime prevention for senior citizens in partnership with the San Diego Police Department. It provides information and counseling to inform the elderly as to how to take steps to avoid being the easy prey of criminals. Because of "Adam 65", street crimes aimed at this highly vulnerable group have been cut from 20 in an average week to about 8.

Senior Citizens who do become victims get prompt attention from the second arm of "Adam 65" - their Victim-Witness assistance program. Clyde has two other senior citizens who are on a part-time basis assisting him in this work. Nearly 200 elderly crime victims have been given direct assistance during the past year.

The "Adam 65" program originally derived its support from the federal government with matching funds from the City of San Diego. Presently its funding comes from private charitable foundations and San Diego businesses.
