THE PROGRAM

CRAIG NOEL, Executive Producer, has carried the world of the Old Globe on his creative shoulders for more than forty years, and IS the symbol of the theatre in San Diego.

When the Old Globe's first Shakespeare was played in the spring of 1935, for the two year California Pacific International Exposition, 20 year old Craig was a member of the Bam Players, an amateur group which became the nucleus of the first community theatre productions in the Old Globe after the close of the Exposition.

At 24, his directing career began with "The Bindle-Stiff's Dream". Between 1939 and 1941 Noel directed morethan a dozen plays. Drafted in the spring of '44, Private Craig Noel was off to New Guinea and Luzon. After the war, he was assigned to Special Services and sent to General Douglas MacArthur's Tokyo head-quarters where he directed a rapid fire turnover of new stage plays every three days at Japan's show-house, the Ernie Pyle Theatre. Noel returned to the Old Globe in 1947.

Unselfish, humble, loyal to friends and associates, the magic of Noel's mind has touched myriad from set designers toround-the-globe travelers. The word "gentle man" aptly describes this gentleman, not from Verona, but San Diego. "And the elements so mix'd in him that nature does stand up and say to all the world, "THIS IS A MAN!"
