

THE PROGRAM

On the morning of 16 April the twenty-five hundred officers and men of Amphibious Squadron SEVEN heard the sharp blast of a whistle followed by the words 'moored, shift colors." This marked the completion of a six-month deployment to the Western Pacific and Indian Oceans for the six ships which comprise the squadron. The squadron participated in amphibious assault landing exercises, and visited ports in Thailand, Australia, Singapore, Kenya, and the Phillipines.

Captain Richard F. Green, Commander Amphibious Squadron SEVEN, and Captain Dwight D. Timm, Commanding Officer of the Squadron flagship (USS TARAWA), will recount the thirty-five thousand mile odyssey which led to this San Diego homecoming.

Captain Green a graduate of Villanova University, received his commission in 1957 and qualified as a Naval Aviator the following year. He commanded Patrol Squadrons Twenty-Three and Thirty-One and the USS JUNEAU (LPD-10) prior to assuming his present position. He also served as Special Assistant for Congressional and Media Affairs in the Telecommunication Directorate of the Executive Office of the President.

Captain Timm received his Bachelor of Science Degree from North Dakota University and entered the Navy in 1957. He is a Naval Aviator and commanded Fighter Squadron Ninety-Six and the USS NASHVILLE (LPD-13) prior to assuming his present command. He has logged over four thousand six hundred hours of flight time in over forty different models of fixed and rotary winged aircraft and has more than one thousand carrier attested landings.
