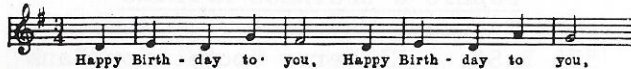

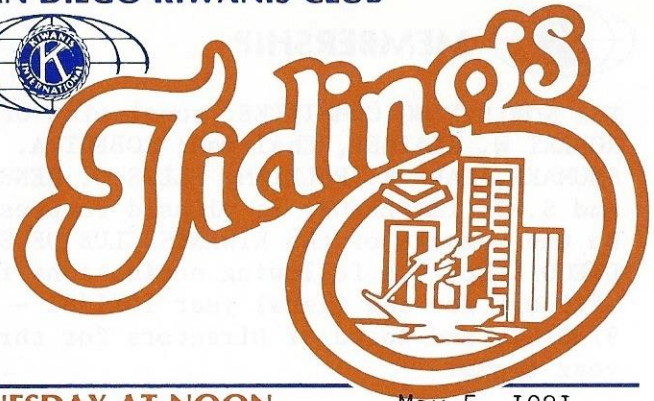

## THE PROGRAM

Professor DENNIS JANA wasn't surprised than an attempt was made on President Regan's life. "I think we're going to have another attempt if Reagan lives on." he warned.

Mr. Jana is an American history professor at National University and something of an authority on assassinations. He has studied the subject for years and lectured on it and espionage in UCSD Extension classes.

Among his extensive collection of assassination materials is a copy of the famous film of President John F. Kennedy being shot in Dallas in 1963, which he shows to his classes.

Professor Jana said he was appalled at the accessibility the public has to its presidents. He does not advocate insulating presidents from all contact with the public but suggests that steps be taken to reduce the chances of a president being assassinated. In addition to not publicizing the President's whereabouts so often, he suggests changing the President's announced route to events he is attending and possibly limiting holders of the office to a single six-year term. This would tend to limit appearances by presidents at events which are purely political and designed to enhance their re-election prospects.

He favors stricter and quicker punishment for persons convicted of violent crimes and predicts a 'law & order' mood will prevail in the future. "If he President with all his protection is gunned down, how safe is it for the rest of us?" Professor Jana asks.

...A big pat on the back for a big man - GALEN COFFMAN -- master chili promoter.

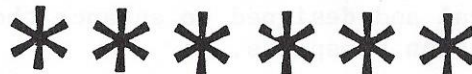
